

# MONEY FOR NATIONAL GUARD IS PLENTIFUL

**MAY 2 - 1916**

**More Than Half Amount Needed  
For Punchbowl Raised**

More than half the amount needed for the national guard has been raised by the committee having the matter in charge of getting the thirteen thousand dollars. The members of the committee are Walter F. Dillingham, F. E. Thompson, A. Lewis, Jr., and Brig-Gen. Samuel I. Johnson. Except for the money which was pledged at the luncheon of the Commercial Club, on Friday, amounting to \$600, \$8400 was subscribed and most of it collected yesterday morning.
