

TRAVEL OF MILITIA OFFICERS REGULATED

Absence In Territory From Their
Proper Stations Must Be
By Authority

In the future officers of the National Guard of Hawaii who desire to travel between the islands of the Hawaiian group, will have to first obtain permission from their respective regimental commanders before leaving the island in which they are regularly stationed.

If the officer contemplates being away from his regular station for a period of less than two weeks, verbal permission will be sufficient, and no orders will be issued in such cases; but where an officer desires to remain away for a longer period than two weeks it will become necessary for him to make proper application for leave of absence. In this case a regimental order will be published covering such leave, and on return to his station, whether the absence has been by authority of verbal permission, or by printed order, the officer must immediately report the date of his return either in person or in writing. Officers belonging to units of, or attached to regiments will apply for leave of absence to the highest tactical commander in the island in which they are stationed, but such applications must be the same as though they were assigned to a regiment, and the same authority must be obtained.

Officers stationed in islands other than Oahu, will, when visiting Honolulu, be required to register their arrival at the office of The Adjutant-General of the Territory, as soon as practicable after their arrival, and at such registration they are required to make a notation as to the authority for absence from their proper station, and probable duration of their stay in Honolulu, or in Oahu.

A book has been provided for this purpose, and has been placed at a place in the armory, where access to it may be had at any time.
