## TV Salute to Isle National Guard

"When the Chips are Down," a 30-minute National Guard movie starring Bob Hope, will be shown on KHVH-TV Sunday at 4 p.m.

This special showing in color, is dedicated by KHVH to members of the Hawaii Army National Guard's 29th Infantry Brigade who will report to active duty May 13th.

Captain Eddie Anderson, well known island Guard officer, was an assistant producer for the movie.
