# 29th Brigade to parade on May 18

Climate of the Armed Forces Week will be a parade by the 29th Brigade at Schofield Barracks on Saturday morning, May 18.

But for many civilians, the highlight of the week will be the rare opportunity to load up the family car and drive over Kolekole Pass on that day.

Both Schofield Barracks and the Naval Ammunition Depot at Laulualei will be open to the public and motorists can cross the Waianae Mountain range in either direction.

Armed Forces week begins Monday, the day the National Guardsmen and Army Reservists of the 100th Battalion, 442nd Infantry, get called up.

The march down Ala Moana Boulevard, a standby in years gone by, has been junked since the 25th Division left the Island.

All military bases on Oahu will be open from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. May 18 for public inspection.

All next week military bands from various forces will conduct noon concerts at the Ala Moana Shopping Center.

Military equipment will be set up for junior to look over at Schofield, Pearl Harbor, Barber's Point, Wheeler and

Hickam Air Force Bases and the Coast Guard station on Rainbow Island.

At Luulualei the public can get a look at the 16-inch projectiles the battleship New Jersey plans to pound North Vietnam with later this year if peace negotiations fail.
