# Naval Reserves and Spanish War Men Get Ovation Excellent Showing Made In Memorial Day Parade

Militia Seamen and Men In Khaki  
Do Themselves Proud In  
Big Line

SPANISH War Veterans (Upper) and Battalion of Naval Reserves, National Guard of Hawaii, Marching In Great Memorial Day Parade, When Thousands of Folk Greeted Them

**T**WO outstanding features of the Memorial Day parade, which caught the attention of the thousands of spectators lining the route of march, were the naval reserve battalion of the national guard and the Spanish War Veterans.

The first is Hawaii's latest addition to her citizen militia preparation. The reserve, approved by the legislature a year ago, has been in active existence only a few weeks and expects to have a training vessel placed at its service in the near future. That the reserve actually exists and already has been recruited to considerable size seemed to be realized by the general public only yesterday. That was its first public appearance.

The young men have undergone training and made a praiseworthy exhibition in the march. They wear uniforms of white serge, trimmed in blue, with black, loosely tied neck pieces and made a very natty appearance.
