

NAVAL MILITIA NEW CUTTERS ON BAY CITY PIER

Members of the naval militia suffered a disappointment yesterday, when the two 30-foot cutters due here from the Brooklyn navy yard for the sole use of the territorial organization failed to arrive on the Wilhelmina.

It is hoped that they will be brought on the Manoa which is scheduled to leave next Friday, though with strike conditions still existing on the coast this may be doubtful, and it is said she will only carry ice house freight. The cutters were on the wharf at San Francisco when the Wilhelmina left there last week.
