

**GUARD OFFICER HAS
GOOD TARGET RECORD**

National Guard officials claim that while the recent record which Lieut. J. A. McAndrew established at Fort Shafter rifle range is high, it is not higher than a record already made by a guard officer.

Lieut. McAndrews scored a total of 275 out of a possible 300, the same score made in 1915 by Col. John D. Easton, 2nd Infantry, N. G. H., firing over the regular army course.

This course is as follows: Two hundred yards, rapid fire; 300 yards, rapid fire; 500 yards, rapid fire; 300 yards, slow fire; 500 yards, slow fire; 600 yards, slow fire.

To win an expert rifleman badge a man must score 253 out of a possible 300. Sharpshooters must score 238 and marksmen 202.
