

GUARDSMEN WAIT CONFIDENTLY FOR DRILL TOMORROW

All is Staged for Competition
to Determine Supremacy
of Militia Companies

Lieut.-col. W. R. Riley, 1st Infantry, N. G. H., who directed the arrangements for the preliminary drill on May 14, will be in charge again tomorrow at Athletic Park to see that the competitive drill to be staged there goes through without a hitch.

Assisting Col. Riley will be Lieut. Alexander May and Lieut. Will Wayne as aides.

Value of each event is to count as follows: Close order, 35; extended order, 30; bayonet exercise, 10; attendance, 20; wall scalings, 5; second place in wall scaling, 4; third place, 3; fourth place, 2, and fifth place, 1.

Five companies will take part in the contest and, with constant practice during the last several weeks, the members are in fine shape, according to Guard officers. During the present week nightly drills have been held. The five companies who will compete are A, F, G, K and M.

Judges are regular officers of the army—Maj. Michael J. Lenihan, acting chief of staff at army headquarters; Capt. Edwin J. Hartshorn, 2nd Infantry, and 1st Lieut. Lloyd R. Fredendall, 2nd Infantry.

At Guard headquarters plans have been made for a royal reception to the visitors from the 3rd Regiment from Maui and the 4th Regiment from Kauai, and expectations are that every officer in the Guard will be present at the Bijou tonight to fill up the section which has been reserved for their use. Officers will wear white. General Johnson is entertaining a party of 80 at the theater, including the members of the contending polo teams and their ladies, official, army and navy, and civilian friends.
