

KOHALA GUARD PLANNING BIG TIME JULY 4TH

Maj. P. W. P. Buett, commanding the 3d Battalion, 2d Infantry, National Guard, and Capt. O. O. Hanson, Company M, 2d Infantry, arrived this morning from Hawaii on the Mauna Kea, bringing word of big preparations in the Kohala district for a grand military and athletic celebration on July 4. Both officers will return tomorrow.

Plans for the big celebration include military drilling by squads from Companies I, K, L and M, athletic contests by guardsmen and civilians, and a big dance at night. There will also be a moving picture show for all enlisted men.

Local guard officials express commendation for the manner in which the Kohala guard is keeping up enthusiasm and boosting the work.

49 FILIPINOS TAKE OUT "FIRST PAPERS" IN FEDERAL COURT

Forty-nine Filipinos, members of Company M of the National Guard, yesterday filed in the federal court their declarations of intention to become American citizens. Clerk George R. Clark stated today that no more declarations will be accepted until the arrival from Washington of a supply of forms, the local supply have been exhausted yesterday. A cablegram requesting additional supplies has been sent to the department of state. It is expected that at least 75 Filipino members of the guard will take out their "first papers."

URGE GUARD OFFICERS TO MEETING TONIGHT
