

FINE GROWTH OF HAWAII'S GUARD IS COMPLIMENTED

Letters complimenting the National Guard of Hawaii on its remarkable development since Brig-gen. Samuel I. Johnson became its commanding officer have been received by Gen. Johnson from Brig-gen Albert L. Mills, chief of the division of militia affairs, and Brig-gen. Montgomery M. Macomb, president of the army war college, both of Washington.
