

GUARDSMEN WILL DO SUB-CALIBER PRACTISE TODAY

From 5 to 6 o'clock this afternoon the men of the 1st Company, Coast Artillery Corps, National Guard of Hawaii, will hold their first sub-caliber target practise at Fort De Russy, under the direction of regular army officers, who believe the company has advanced sufficiently in gun-handling skill to do this work.

The company has been practising with the guns since early in June, and has made good progress. In this afternoon's sub-caliber practise the six-inch guns, in which have been inserted a sub-caliber bore, firing a projectile about one and a half inches in diameter, will be used.

A small power launch from Fort Armstrong will tow a target out to sea about a mile or two, and the guns will be aimed at the moving target, at distances ranging from 2000 to 3000 yards. Capt. G. K. Larrison, commanding the company, is much interested in seeing how the drill will work out.
