

NATIONAL GUARD GIVES SMOKER TO GET ACQUAINTED

With the idea of getting better acquainted and showing Honoluluans what the National Guard is doing, and what equipment it has, Company D, National Guard of Hawaii, will give a smoker and vaudeville show tonight at 8 o'clock in the library of the Armory, to which all members of the company, their friends, and others interested in National Guard affairs, are invited.

In general charge of the affair is Lieut. Schaefer, while Neil Slattery is chairman of the stunts committee. Refreshments are being looked after by M. G. Emmans, while M. B. Henshaw is chairman of the committee on smokes. Capt. Walter V. Kolb of D company is confident that the smoker will be one of the biggest and most successful social affairs held by the company this year to date.

Besides having the National Guard band in attendance all evening, Company D, National Guard, which is giving a big smoker at the armory this evening, has prepared a vaudeville program of 20 numbers. The full program for tonight's smoker follows: Selections; band; musical act, Rodrigues children; song, Buster Stacker; selections, Paradise Glee Club; Scotch songs, Morton; flute and guitar, Larson and Kāpu; song, Neil Slattery; pianist, A. A company of engineers for the National Guard of Hawaii is soon to be an established fact. Seventy men have agreed to join the company, and Charles R. Forbes, superintendent of public works, was commissioned today as captain.

Thirty of the 70 are skilled engineers, while the remaining 40 are trained workmen. Pending the receipt of instructions, orders and equipment from the war department, the company will be drilled as infantry.

The first work to be done will be making a map of the new N. G. H. target range and surveying its boundaries. Simultaneously, maps and plans for the mobilization camp, on the same site, will be prepared. As the company includes a number of workmen trained in building concrete structures, the range can be built soon after title to the site is secured, which is expected to be obtained without difficulty.

Promotions of two well-liked young officers, National Guard of Hawaii, have just been announced.

After serving as aide-de-camp to Governor Pinkham, who is commander-in-chief of the territorial militia, Capt. James D. Dougherty, 1st Infantry, N. G. H., is promoted to major and aide-de-camp, with rank from August 25. He has been ordered to report personally to the governor for duty.

Promotion from a lieutenancy to a captaincy has been awarded 2nd Lieut. Gustav E. Schaefer, 1st Infantry, N. G. H. His new position ranks from August 31. The captain has been assigned to the 1st Infantry with orders to report for duty to the commanding officer.
