

GUARD TO ENTER FOOTBALL TEAM IN ARMY LEAGUE

Jumping into the game with both feet, the 1st Infantry, National Guard of Hawaii, plans to take an active part in football this year, and will enter a team in the army football league this year, National Guard headquarters announced today.

Lieut. P. M. Smoot, the regimental athletic officer, has called on company commanders for football material, and practise is expected to begin in a few weeks. William Rosa, the well-known Honolulu football star, will captain the regiment's team during this season.
