

GUARDSMEN TO TAKE 'EXAM' FOR PROMOTION

Officers and Enlisted Men To Appear Before Board

Officers and enlisted men of the National Guard of Hawaii will undergo examination for promotion and commissions, tonight at the Armory. According to a special order, issued from headquarters of the national guard, several recently appointed officers, and a number of enlisted men will appear before the officers examining board for examination. They are second Lieuts. Harold Godfrey, Milton P. Morgan, Frank J. Dougherty, Clinton G. Owen and Arthur K. Wheeler.

The enlisted men are Regimental Sgt. Maj. Lewes B. Reeves, First Sgt. Philip N. Sing, Sgt. Frank K. Kalua and Sgt. Robert H. Lowrey.

In addition to these, five first lieutenants will be ordered before the board the later part of this week for examination for promotion. They are first Lieuts. John W. Caldwell, George K. Larrison, Edgar S. Barry, William J. Hampton and Charles R. Bostwick.

As many of these officers and enlisted men are serving with troops, they will be benefitted by a percentage for efficiency as outlined in special orders in part as follows: "2. In examinations of officers serving with troops a weight of twenty-five may be given for present practical efficiency.."

The results of the examinations will be published at an early date.
