

PREPARING FOR BIG MILITARY DAY

The committees of the National Guard on Fourth of July celebration had a long session with the chairman of the Board of Supervisors in the County Building Saturday night in the effort to straighten out the matter of where the finances for the affair are to come from. Reports from the transportation committee developed the gratifying fact that the nine companies of outside troops may be moved into Lihue and back home again without charge. That cut the prospective expenses in half at one shot and greatly simplified the problem.

The supervisors, according to Mr. Wishard, were doubtful that they could appropriate money for the entire budget of expenses, but it appeared that a total of \$500 of the items submitted by the committee were within the law; and he thought that the supervisors could be relied upon to supply that amount, the officers of the Guard to raise the remaining sum of \$500.

The chairman of the finance committee replied to this that if the supervisors would appropriate \$500 as suggested the officers of the regiment would put up the remaining \$500. That seemed satisfactory all around and was adopted by vote as the plan to be worked upon.

The finance committee announced that it would issue cards without delay to all officers of the regiment inviting their contributions.

Captain Carden, for the sports committee, made a very satisfactory report of plans for the big Fourth of July program.

It was stated at the meeting that General Samuel I. Johnson and perhaps other military notables would be present for the events.
